DART undertook, in the MOU, to supply a new liveried 4x4 vehicle and to fund approximately half of the staff costs of the service. We have also supplied additional ancillary equipment as requested by our co-responders. We have been well supported by our local community with a number of fundraising events and have been successful in obtaining some grants from our local parish, district, and county councils.
